ACFID 2024 Photography Competition

‘Solidarity and Resilience: the power of the collective’

Guidelines for entrants

Theme

The ACFID 2024 Photography Competition invites participants to explore the theme of **“Solidarity and Resilience: the power of the collective”**. Photographs can capture any aspect of the work of ACFID members and/or their partner organisations or other civil society organisations in the Global Majority.

Who can enter?

This competition is free to enter. It is open to:

- staff, volunteers and contractors of ACFID members.
- staff, volunteers and contractors of ACFID members’ partner organisations.
- community members working with ACFID members and/or their partner organisations overseas.

ACFID staff and competition judges are not allowed to enter.

When do entries close?

Entries close at 5pm (AEST) on **Monday 30 September 2024**.

Conditions of entry

Image format	JPEG or PNG, no greater than 5MB.
Orientation	Landscape or portrait orientation.
Resolution	Images will be reproduced for the exhibition at an A3 size. Ensure your images are of sufficiently high quality and well-exposed, sharp and clear with good contrast for reproduction and printing. Minimum 3000 pixels on the longest side.
Number of submissions	Up to 2 per participant.

Image description	Each photograph must be accompanied by a brief description (150 words maximum) providing context and inspiration.
Editing and AI	All works must be created with a camera (phone camera accepted). All works must not use or include any synthetic or artificially generated images or elements (including generative fill in post-production). All works must not have been created or developed, in whole or in part, using any generative artificial intelligence tools. Any editing of entries should maintain the integrity of the original image's content and context.
Timing	The image must have been captured between 30 June 2023 and 30 September 2024. Images that have been shared with ACFID previously for other purposes can still be submitted for this competition.
Subject matter	Images must meet the standards in the ACFID Code of Conduct . Images must depict the work of ACFID member organisations, or their partner organisations/communities. They must explore the themes of Solidarity or Resilience

Awards

People's Choice Award

All attendees at ACFID's National Conference will be invited to vote in the People's Choice Award. One People's Choice Award will be awarded to the entrant who receives the most votes.

Prize: Certificate of Achievement and \$250 (AUD) prize for the organisation whose work is depicted in the winning photograph.

Categories

One winner will be chosen for each of the following categories:

- Solidarity
- Resilience

Prize: Certificate of Achievement and \$250 (AUD) prize for the organisation whose work is depicted in the winning photograph.

Judging

There will be a judging panel of up to four judges selected by ACFID. In making their decision the judging panel will consider each entry for its:

- Creativity and originality
- Relevance to the theme
- Emotional impact
- Technical skills

If required, entries may be shortlisted by the judging panel prior to display at ACFID Conference. Participants will be notified of the outcome of any shortlisting.

The decision of the panel is final and no correspondence will be entered into.

Participants must ensure that they have the informed consent of any person photographed, for their photo to be submitted to this competition. Participants must make sure that those photographed are aware that their image will be displayed as part of the ACFID 2024 National Conference and may be shared by ACFID publicly.
